Finding Connection on Canada's East Coast



Tammy lives in Milford, Nova Scotia with her husband Peter and three children: Taylor, Wesley, and Mya. She came to know Jesus personally through Alpha 22 years ago, and in 2018, she planted Groundswell Church, which currently serves Truro, a town of 14,000 people.

Since getting connected to the work of CCLN in 2020, these are some of Tammy's reflections on how the Lord has used it all.

Making a Large Country Small

Pastoring on the East Coast is wonderful, but it comes with its unique challenges. Canada is a large country, and ministry here can feel siloed from the rest of the nation.

As a lead pastor, it is honestly challenging to find and build safe friendships. Despite this challenge, I have always aimed to connect with other pastors, both near and far from me.

Once I began connecting with pastors through CCLN, it felt like the country, somehow, became even smaller. Before CCLN, my efforts in building connections might have extended as far as Ontario; now, I have relationships with pastors from coast to coast. Beyond these connections, I feel that

I've discovered a family of like-minded people who are leading the church at this time.

Through the spaces created by CCLN, my husband and I have been able to nurture deeply meaningful friendships that aren't just my friends in ministry but our friends in ministry.

Churches Helping Churches In Crisis

At one of CCLN's Pastors Retreats, we were all given photos of other pastoral couples to take home and were invited to pray for them throughout the year. My new friends, Jono and Nicole Zantingh from Evolve Church in Edmonton, took home the photo of Peter and me.

A few weeks later, our region was hit by Hurricane Fiona.

Jono and Nicole heard about what happened and reached out immediately. Despite leading a



Investing In Young Pastors, Including My Daughter

Ministry is hard and it seems like pastors are dropping like flies in Canada. We have more churches than we have pastors prepared, both in craft and character, to lead them.

With many young leaders on my staff, including my daughter, Taylor, I believe deeply in championing young pastors and instilling qualities that will sustain them for a lifetime of living out their calling.

I'm also aware that, although I want to provide these young pastors with everything they need, I can't.

newer church of the same age as our own, they ended up sending a generous donation to support our service to the community around us. It was so special to feel that support from this couple I met just a month ago. It made us feel like

it's not just Groundswell over here in Truro and Evolve Church over there in Edmonton; we are all in this together.



My daughter Taylor is a part of the first class of the Emerging Leaders Lab, and I am so grateful. For her, it's been a safe space to be formed by competent, seasoned leaders and to process with like-minded pastors in her age and stage. She's already learning and living into a lot of wisdom that I wish I had at the beginning.

Ultimately, I think being in a program like this is not just a gift for her or even just for our church;

it's a gift that will pay back for decades in the Church in Canada.

The Lead Pastors Fellowship

An Interview with Joel Varty

Discovering a New Vision for Pastoring

Joel and his wife, Jessica, have three kids: Brixton, Navy, and Clover. He has been on staff at Celebration Church in Edmonton for 10 years, moving from facilities to youth ministry, and now serving as the one of the lead pastors.

Here's a snapshot of Joel's journey as a pastor and how the Lord brought the ministry of CCLN at just the right time.



"It Was Dark."

Through years in the church and following Jesus, I think I picked up an unhelpful image of what it meant to be a pastor.

Somewhere along the way, I began to see pastors mainly as CEO-type leaders.

While I felt called to lead in the church, knowing myself as more of a shepherd with a soft heart, I didn't feel like I fit that mold. There was a sincere struggle to find my identity as a pastor.

Then came the pandemic. Our ministry seemed to hit the brakes, but at the same time, there was an acceleration of insecurity and a deep sense of loneliness in my inner

world. It's hard to put words to this season - it just felt dark. I know most pastors experienced a sense of powerlessness and overwhelm during this time, and I was no exception. The polarization and criticism were crushing. I felt in over my head. Even in the work, I couldn't shake this sense that I needed to prove myself somehow.

You can't just process this kind of burden with your church; it's a really select group of people that can shoulder that unique weight with you. I had a few of those relationships, but the connections were too few and far between to sustain me.

I needed a consistent family in the Church world.

Gaining More Than What I Expected

Attending CCLN's Pastors Retreat with my wife Jessica was absolutely pivotal; it has become a core memory for us. CCLN facilitated a space that allowed for deep, meaningful connections and conversations. It went far beyond the networking that I was used to. There was one moment where Jessica and I were being surrounded in prayer, and

I remember looking up and, for the first time in a while, thinking, 'I can actually do this.'

It's not an exaggeration to say that my wife and I made deeper connections in those few days than in ten years of church ministry.



A Vision For Healthy Pastoring

Through CCLN's Pastors Retreat, podcast, and other gatherings, I finally found the language for an identity of pastoring that I had been searching for all along. Today, I'm coming alive, loving the people at Celebration Church as the shepherd God made me to be.

I've seen what I emphasize in life and ministry change too, as new values become more deeply embedded in my life. I love how CCLN works backward from the hope to see renewal in Canada and necessitates healthier churches and pastors.

I think every pastor wants to see their city changed, and for me, the starting place has become my own health.



Within that, I also find I'm increasingly shifting my focus away from finding new methods or proving the worth of the ministry I lead, and now asking different questions entirely: Am I healthy? Do I love God with all my being? Through this, I've seen the Spirit make me more open-handed, widening my desire beyond the church I lead, to wanting to see the Church in my city thrive.

Today, through CCLN, I feel like a completely different person and pastor, but somehow more myself than ever.


A Moment for the Canadian Church

From January 11-13, we were able to partner with Searock Sessions to host a time for **60+ U.S. and Canadian pastors** to intentionally glean from the Church in Vancouver.





The challenge of pastoring in Canada's diverse geographical and cultural landscape is yielding insights that are valuable for the broader Church. In the past, it has been more typical for Canadian pastors to approach the U.S. Church for fresh and creative strategies. However, this gathering represents a growing trend, with U.S. pastors now seeking learnings from Canadian leaders who have witnessed Jesus building His Church in the midst of a more widely secularized context.

This pattern only underscores the importance of strengthening Canadian pastors in our time.



Addressing the Complex Pastoral Challenges of Our Day

If we were tasked with listing all the challenges pastors face, there wouldn't be enough room on this page. One of the acute challenges confronting pastors today is Western culture's view of the Bible, specifically its historic moral positions as irrelevant and, in some cases, as dangerous. Using Jesus' parable of the Kingdom, there is a temptation for pastors to "change the seed" due to the hostile conditions of the day's soil; in other words, to change the Word to fit the time. Into that temptation, we want to be one voice that deposits courage in pastors to instead stand on the bedrock of God's Word, and empowers them to hold a fidelity to the unchanging truth of Scripture








